

MAYOR'S MESSAGE

ONE OF THE BEST RIGHT HERE IN OUR OWN BACKYARD...

I recently had an opportunity to tour the Cancer Institute of New Jersey (CINJ) located in New Brunswick after which I was pleased to have the Institute's Director, Dr. Robert DiPaola and Councilwoman Gabrielle Cahill as guests on my March television program, Eye on Piscataway. It was certainly a learning experience to find out that this facility, located in our own backyard, is one of the nation's 40 National Cancer Institutes-designated Comprehensive Cancer Center and the only one in New Jersey. As a Center of Excellence of the University of Medicine and Dentistry of New Jersey (UMDNJ)-Robert Wood Johnson Medical School, at CINJ they have a team of distinguished researchers and physicians who are internationally recognized in their respective field. Along with delivering comprehensive care to adults and children they study cancer prevention and control within the general population and work to ensure that laboratory discoveries are refined and applied to patient care as quickly as possible. As a designated National Center Institute they are able to provide access to clinical trials not available at other hospitals, clinics or doctor's offices. Some of the recent clinical trials involve healthy male volunteers for a Prostate Cancer Study as well as a clinical trial studying the safety of a malaria drug for Melanoma use. You would probably have to be living under a rock not to know that New Jersey like most other states from coast to coast have a variety of economic issues that have reached a critical point. And while finger pointing seems to be a good exercise for many, it doesn't solve the problems – not a single one. Several New Jersey mayors, including myself, contacted members of our D.C. delegation to ask that they work tirelessly to prevent egregious cuts in the Community

Development Block Grants (CDBG) which is direct federal aid to cities and towns. The CDBG Program was established under Title 1 of the Community Development Act of 1974 and one of its major components was and still is to improve community services. Recipients of CDBG federal funds must also demonstrate the effectiveness of their program expenditures-it is a highly transparent program. If the proposed CDBG cuts are made these cuts will directly impact each and every one of our municipalities. Among other things the funding is used for construction, social service projects, energy efficient grants, and to hire law enforcement officers. Without it, local officials risk losing millions in matching money from private and other sources. Many of the children most in need will be dropped from the Head Start program and over \$60 million dollars is scheduled to be cut from Homeland Security programs that protect our vulnerable seaports and transit systems from terrorist attacks. In Piscataway, CDBG funds helped to build our parks, install ramps on our streets and ramps to make public buildings accessible to the handicapped. This funding also finances the local Meals on Wheels program which delivers food to elderly and disabled people.

New Jersey Congressman Rush Holt said, "This bill is so extreme, it will remove some of the support posts in American society". We hope that cooler heads will prevail and these catastrophic cuts that impact, for the most part the average citizen, will be restored.

The residents of Sterling Village who were displaced from Piscataway's senior complex in January due to a busted water pipe have returned to their homes. Residents from 64 units were evacuated in January after a water line between the roof and the fourth floor froze and then burst. We did our best to accommodate all those who were displaced and we appreciate everything that our seniors and their families have had to cope with during this extremely difficult time. We also thank the many emergency services that supported both the evacuation and the relocation of the residents. They include the Senior Citizen staff, the Hillcrest Management Company, Office of Emergency Management (OEM), Holmes Marshall, Possumtown, No. Stelton, Arbor and River Road Fire Companies, Arbor, River Road and Dunellen Rescue Squads and the Piscataway Citizens Emergency Response Team(CERT).

**“STEP INTO SPRING” - FREE PEDOMETERS
TO GET YOU HEALTHY BY WALKING**

As part of the ongoing Mayors' Health and Wellness Campaign, free pedometers, along with information on how to start walking to get healthy, are available in the Township Clerk's office.

The campaign, headed by Councilwoman Michele Lombardi said, “We hope that the pedometers will get entire families involved and make walking a part of daily life. Walking is the easiest and most accessible form of exercise for everyone regardless of age.” The goal of this program is to start off slow and aim for a goal of 10,000 steps a day. If you really don't like to walk, but you like to jog or run, a pedometer can track your steps whether you are moving slow or fast – pedometers work well for jogging or running. Along with the pedometers which were donated by Johnson and Johnson Healthcare Systems, packets will include instructions on the use of the pedometer, information on the benefits of walking and locations in Piscataway and other areas to walk. ☆ Recycling Center/Mini Dump 2011 & Recycling Center ID Pass Cards have been mailed to all residential property owners. The ID card **MUST BE PRESENTED AT THE GATE**, along with Driver License as Proof of Residency. The rules and hours of the Center were enclosed in the mailing. This program was implemented to be more convenient for the residents. Coupons are required for bagged brush, lumber, household debris, carpeting, furniture and all other acceptable non-recyclable materials. Coupons are not required for disposal of recyclable material, including recyclables picked up curbside, in addition to batteries, (two) tires, motor oil, anti-freeze and metal. Branches must be no longer than five (5) feet and four (4) inches in diameter. The largest vehicle allowed in the Center is a half-ton pickup truck. No trucks with built up sideboards are allowed. Pickup trucks must surrender two (2) coupons plus an additional coupon for a trailer no larger than 4x8 feet.

☆ **NOT PERMITTED: HAZARDOUS OR TOXIC WASTE, CONSUMER ELECTRONICS, CHEMICALS OR PAINT, CONTRACTOR DEBRIS, DIRT, CONCRETE OR OTHER ROCK TYPE DEBRIS.**

☆ Coupons for grass disposal are required and may be purchased in the Tax Office, Monday – Friday, 8:30 a.m. – 4:30 p.m. Note: Township offices are closed each day from 12:20 p.m. to 1:30 p.m.

☆ Residents may schedule two (2) bulk trash curbside *pick ups* and one (1) brush curbside *pick up* per household per calendar year.

**Refrain from approaching
wildlife during spring
and summer**

Residents are reminded to refrain from approaching wildlife during the spring and summer months, the most active period for young animals. During these months the lives of many young animals are disrupted and perceived acts of kindness often result in tragedy for young wildlife taken from their homes. Handling wild animals can pose a health risk for both people and pets and can transmit life-threatening diseases, such as rabies, parasites and roundworms, lice, fleas and ticks. Human intervention is usually unnecessary and can be detrimental to an animal's natural survival instinct. People are encouraged to exercise discretion and keep contact with wildlife to a minimum.

Disposing of Animal Waste - Piscataway's Ordinance (93-44) strongly advises residents who have dogs to provide for the cleanup and removal of animal waste on both public and private property. Any person who violates this provision may be subject to a penalty of not less than \$25 and no more than \$500 for each violation. We urge residents to be considerate of their neighbors and the community-at-large when walking their dogs.
