732-562-2331. Checks for applicants who filed before June 1, 2010 are scheduled to be mailed by mid-July. *A reminder that Sewer Bill charges are due on September 1, 2010 – there is a 10-day grace period.*

Reminder: In contacting the Health Office in Piscataway, call 732-562-2323, listen for the prompts - #3 puts you through to the Health Office. If you get a voice mail, please leave your number and a complete message and someone will return your call.

Rabies Advisory: The Middlesex County Public Health Department advises residents to pay close attention to the following guidelines in order to prevent rabies from being transmitted to themselves or their pets. Immediately report a bite from a wild or domestic animal to the Health Office. Wash animal bite wounds thoroughly with soap and water as soon as possible after the bite. Consult a physician as soon as possible. Immediately report any wild animal showing signs of unusual behavior. Be sure that all family pets are up to date on their rabies vaccination. Animal proof your home and yard. Make sure all garbage containers have tight fitting lids, do not leave pet food or water outside, do not allow rainwater to collect in outside containers or equipment and keep yard free of garbage and debris. Do not feed or handle wild animals. Avoid contact with stray animals or pets other than your own. Try to prevent your pets from coming into contact with wild animals. Screen off vents to attics and other areas that could provide shelter for bats.

- ☆ Recycling Trash Center coupons and Recycling Center ID passes have been mailed to all residential owners. The 2010 Coupon MUST BE PRESENTED AT THE GATES, along with Driver's License as Proof of Residency. Rules and regulations were in the mailing.
- ☆ Coupons ARE required for lumber, household debris, carpeting, furniture and all other non recyclable materials. Coupons are NOT required for disposal of recyclable materials, including batteries, tires, motor oil, branches, metal (washers, dryers, dishwashers, hot water heaters, refrigerators, air conditioners and all recyclables picked up curbside. **NOT ACCEPTABLE:** PAINT, HAZARDOUS WASTE, KITCHEN GARBAGE, CONTRACTOR DEBRIS, DIRT/ROCKS/STONES.
- ☆ Residents entering the Center must have their vehicle properly insured, inspected and registered in Piscataway. *The largest vehicle allowed is a half-ton pick up truck.* NO COMMERCIAL VEHICLES OR TRUCKS WITH SIDE BOARDS ARE PERMITTED AND NO BOXED U-HAULS OR MOVING TRUCKS ARE PERMITTED.
- ☆ **GRASS DISPOSAL COUPONS:** Grass, leaves, bagged brush, and vegetation being dropped off at the Mini Dump is required to have a GRASS DISPOSAL COUPON. COUPONS are available for purchase @ \$1.00/per COUPON/minimum purchase two (2) COUPONS. COUPONS may be purchased in the Tax Office (Monday-Friday, 8:30 a.m. to 12:30 p.m. or 1:30 p.m. to 4:30 p.m.) or by mail. Send SASE and check, made out to Piscataway Township, for number of requested COUPONS to: Tax Office, 455 Hoes Lane, Piscataway, NJ 08854. NOTE: COUPONS are valid only for the year of purchase. There are no refunds.
- ☆ Televisions, VCR's, Computers, Printers, Monitors must be brought to HESSTECH, 45 Executive Avenue, Edison, NJ (near Middlesex County College).
- ☆ CURBSIDE TRASH/BRUSH PICKUP BY APPOINTMENT: Homeowners may schedule two (2) trash pickups, and one (1) branch pickup from January to the middle of October. To schedule a curbside pickup, call the DPW office at 732-562-2390. In the summer months, there could be a 4 to 6 week wait. NOTE: October pickups are generally fully booked by September.

MOMENTS IN OUR HISTORY..

Did you know that right here in Piscataway, George Washington stayed at Ross Hall on July 4th 1778 where he wrote the orders for the troops for the first grand celebration of the Declaration of Independence? This was the second anniversary of the Declaration of Independence and the Continental Army, following Washington's orders, marched across Raritan Landing Bridge, lined the banks and discharged their weapons, first up the line then down the line. Called a feu-de-joie (French for "fire of joy") this running fire of guns is used for occasions of public rejoicing. After which, Washington ordered an extra ration of rum for the troops.

Later that evening Washington hosted a ball for officers and their ladies at Ross Hall. Although Ross Hall is no longer standing, its parlor walls have been entrusted to the Metlar-Bodine House, Piscataway's Historic Museum.
