

## MAYOR'S MESSAGE

### *PISCATAWAY SOLAR PANEL PROJECT SETS EXAMPLE OF CLEAN ENERGY USE*

*I* extend my very best wishes to all the residents of our community for a happy, prosperous and healthy New Year. Council members, Mark Hardenburg, Ward 1, Steve Cahn, Ward 3, Michele Lombardi, Ward 4, and the newest Councilman, Jim Bullard, Ward 2, send their holiday greetings along with their thanks and appreciation for the tremendous support given them during the recent election. We are also very grateful to former Ward 2 Councilwoman Loretta Keimel for her eight (8) years of dedicated service to the community-at-large and particularly for her devotion to her constituents in Ward 2. Loretta has retired from being in the public eye and even though she is no longer a member of the council we will surely continue to look to her for her good counsel.



It was a sunny day in the Township where at a news conference we unveiled a set of American made solar panels that have been installed on the Department of Public Works (DPW) building. These panels will lower energy costs and increase energy efficiency. The site is now equipped with nearly 400 roof-mounted panels to collect and transform the sun's energy into power for the building. It will save tax dollars, reduce fossil-fuel dependence and help to clean up the environment. The panels have a 30-year life span with some efficiency gradually dipping over time as weather may tend to wear them out.

We were pleased to have U.S. Senator Robert Menendez, Congressman Frank Pallone Jr., State Senator Bob Smith and several of our council members join us at the unveiling of the project. Senator Menendez has been urging Congress to push President Obama's administration to create a direct-funding mechanism in the 2011 federal budget for similar projects throughout the country. We hope he will be successful. As Senator Menendez noted, "If

we give resources to communities, they can be part of a movement to transform our energy needs to renewable resources and, thereby, help to reduce our dependence on foreign oil".

The solar panels were made available through the American Recovery and Reinvestment Act of 2009 (federal stimulus money). The \$528,000 grant that we received in the spring allowed us to buy the panels and have them installed without borrowing, something that would have raised the price by adding interest. Having these panels will contribute toward saving almost 25 percent of the operating costs of the building. The system was designed by Birdsall Services Group of Cranford, and the panels were installed by Manor II Electric of Holmdel, NJ.

It was interesting in my research on solar energy to read that Leonardo Da Vinci predicted a solar industrialization as far back as the year 1447. Granted it took a while to be in the public domain but today in 2011, it is predicted that 50% of the world's energy will come from renewable sources by the year

2040. At the moment we are told that the worldwide demand for solar energy is currently greater than the supply.

While the solar panels are the latest green effort on the Township government's part we have also installed more energy-efficient lights in all of our buildings, gone to LED traffic signals and converted to a more energy efficient heating, ventilation and air-conditioning system. We even use motor oils and solvents removed from our vehicles in our wash bay to heat part of DPW headquarters. We have no intention of stopping here. We will continue to explore ideas and to work on all fronts to produce more and better energy conservation. It is, for certain, the wave of the future.

*I want to remind residents that there is an all year-round food drive in Piscataway with collection sites at both J. F. Kennedy and Westergard Libraries. You are asked to be as generous as you can-the need is acute. Canned and packaged food items are requested (no glass) and it is very important that you do NOT donate outdated food items. Please check the dates before you donate.*

## JANUARY IS RADON ACTION MONTH

RADON has been identified as a serious health threat and the leading cause of lung cancer for non-smokers and the second leading cause of lung cancer after smoking. The risk of developing lung

cancer from elevated levels of radon is ten times more than exposure to second-hand smoke; resulting in approximately 21,000 deaths in the United States per year.

Fortunately, testing for radon is simple and inexpensive. The DEP Radon Program can provide a list of certified companies that provide testing services or

do-it-yourself test kits. Test kits can also be obtained in most hardware stores. If the test indicates a radon problem, radon mitigation systems can be installed at a cost similar to that of other home repairs. 

To apply for a 2011 license, the animal's rabies certificate must not expire prior to November 30, 2011 or a rabies booster will be needed. The State Department of Health recommends that pet owners revaccinate their dogs and cats every two years despite the three-year duration of immunity most vaccines provide. This recommendation is made to present lapses in immunity resulting from late or delayed revaccinations at the end of the three-year period*

Once on the site, search for the report by name, case number, or date of the accident. This service allows people to obtain a copy of the accident report whenever they want to from their home, office or anywhere in the United States. Police Reports. US, the company that maintains the Web site, not the Police Department, will charge a \$4.00 fee.

 Residents who have received permits from the Construction Office for the installation of new furnaces, water heaters and air conditioners are required to have a follow-up inspection by Township officials to be certain that everything has been properly installed. In addition to batteries, tires, motor oil, branches, leaves and metal, coupons are not required for disposal of recyclable materials, including recyclables picked up curbside. The largest vehicle allowed in the Recycling Center is a half-ton pickup truck. No trucks with built up sideboards are allowed. Pickup trucks must surrender two (2) coupons plus an additional coupon for a trailer no larger than 4x8 feet.
