

MAYOR'S MESSAGE "SPRING IS IN THE AIR..."

It's that time of year when we are ready to shed our winter coats and get out into the warmer weather. And for most of us, it can't come too soon. We have been very fortunate on the east coast this year not having had really bad weather for any long period of time. Unfortunately, other parts of the country haven't been so lucky what with crippling snowstorms, devastating hurricanes and deadly tornados. So many lives have been lost, so many communities literally devastated, so many people not knowing how they will ever be able to reverse the horror they have experienced. We are, indeed, very lucky and we hope and pray that in time all those who have suffered such incredible hardship will be able to successfully move forward.

I'm sure as you travel around town you've noticed the many areas where roadway construction is underway. Many of the jobs are Middlesex County projects - the completion of Rt. 18 is a state project and then there are streets in Piscataway that are being reconstructed by the Township. With all of this construction going on we have worked diligently to be sure that transportation planners and engineers

consistently design, construct and maintain state, county, local or federally funded roadways and bridges to provide safe access for pedestrians, bicyclists and transit users of all ages and abilities. In fact, New Jersey is one of the first ten states to make "Complete Streets" an official internal policy which means that consideration to the needs of all users, including bicyclists and pedestrians must be considered when roadways are being designed. The New Jersey Department of Transportation's (NJDOT) concept expands their existing policy by noting that when designing roadways it must include transit users, the mobility impaired, and others, making sure that no users are left out of a project. From the beginning of a project, features such as sidewalks, wheelchair ramps, bike lanes, crosswalks and street signals must now be included in the design of a project.

This new way of thinking about roadway construction and offering residents safe sidewalks and bike paths fits into the larger issue, the nation's plea for people to get out of their cars and exercise more by walking or biking. Now that gas prices have soared, more people than ever may actually heed that call. According to the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC), the obesity rate in 2010 in New Jersey for adults was 35.7% and for children, ages 2 - 19 (12.5 million children), the rate was 17%. All across the country these rates are rapidly rising. I would doubt that New Jersey is an exception.

And while exercising isn't the only way to stem this obesity tide, it is a very important component. One of the major recommendations called for by the First Lady Michelle Obama's

"Let's Move Cities and Towns" campaign includes getting children to become more physically active by walking or biking in safe areas in their communities. As part of the Mayors Wellness Campaign, initiated by the New Jersey League of Municipalities, all mayors have been urged to build programs and infrastructure to get their constituents exercising more, eating properly and living healthier and better lives. In February 2012, the New Jersey Bike & Walk Coalition met at the Bloustein School of Planning and Public Policy at Rutgers University to discuss city planning that accommodates not only cars but also pedestrians and bikers. This is an issue whose time has come. Through the collaborative effort of all of us working together the way people think and behave may change as they realize that healthy community design, pedestrian and bicycle-friendly city planning, and the health issues of inactivity and obesity are tied together. Piscataway will continue to be at the forefront of this issue.

The Iron Horse in the Garden State: RAILROADS IN NEW JERSEY, 1812-1930

On Sunday, April 29th, at The Metlar-Bodine House Museum, guest speaker Dr. David Fowler will present “The Iron Horse in the Garden State: Railroads in New Jersey, 1812-1930” at 2 p.m. at the River Road Museum.

Even more so than today, railroads had a pervasive presence and an immense social, economic, cultural, and technological influence in the late nineteenth and early twentieth centuries. Then as now, most people in New Jersey were within earshot, at least, of the sound of a train. Using a variety of media such as maps, printed works, and graphic images, Dr. Fowler will discuss the early phases of railroads in New Jersey, as well as their influence on politics, agriculture, labor, technology, suburbanization, resorts, and immigration.

David J. Fowler received his MA and PhD in American history from Rutgers University. In addition to being a consultant and researcher, he works as Project Historian with Special Collections and University Archives at Rutgers University Libraries, where he edited the late Donald A. Sinclair's *Railroads and New Jersey: A Bibliography of Contemporary Publications, 1812-1921* (2011). Most recently Dr. Fowler served as guest curator for the exhibit *All Aboard! Railroads and New Jersey, 1812-1930*, which was mounted in the Special Collections gallery.

• **Recycling/Trash Center Coupons and Recycling Center ID Passes have been mailed to all residential property owners.**

The Piscataway Township 2012 Recycling ID CARD was mailed to every Township Residential Property Owner and **MUST BE PRESENTED AT THE GATE**, along with Drivers License as Proof of Residency. The Rules and Hours of the Center were enclosed in the mailing.

- Coupons are required for bagged brush, lumber, household debris, carpeting, furniture and all other acceptable non-recyclable materials.
- Coupons are required for grass disposal and may be purchased in the Tax Office starting April 2, 2012 – 8:30 a.m. – 12:20 p.m. and 1:30 p.m. – 4:30 p.m. Cost per Coupon is \$1.00, minimum purchase of two (2).
- Coupons are not required for disposal of recyclable materials. This includes all recyclables picked up curbside, in addition to batteries, (2) tires, motor oil, antifreeze and metal. **Brush may be brought no longer than 5ft lengths or greater than 4 inches in diameter.**
 - Residents are encouraged to recycle hazardous household material and paint at Middlesex County locations on the designated dates and times. **REMINDER TO ALL RESIDENTS – WE DO NOT ACCEPT ANY HAZARDOUS WASTE OR TOXIC WASTE MATERIALS, CHEMICALS OR PAINTS AT THE DPW TRASH CENTER.**
- ALL Residents entering the Trash Center must have their vehicles properly insured, inspected and registered in Piscataway. **REMINDER: NO TRUCKS LARGER THAN HALF TON PICKUPS ARE ALLOWED AND NO TRUCKS WITH SIDEBOARDS WILL BE ALLOWED.** Pickup Trucks and Full Size Vans are required to surrender two (2) passes per visit.
- ELECTRONIC WASTES are now accepted at the Recycling Center. Residents still have the option of bringing them to: SIMS - 401 MILL ROAD, EDISON, NJ - 1st SATURDAY OF EVERY MONTH – 9 a.m. – 1 p.m. and 3rd MONDAY OF EVERY MONTH – 12 p.m. – 4 p.m.
- To make appointments for Bulk Trash/Brush pickups, call 732-562-2390. Residents can schedule two (2) Bulk Trash pick ups and one (1) Brush pick up from January to mid-October. Branches must be bundled and tied – **NO BAGGED BRUSH ALLOWED.** During the summer months there could be a 6-8 week wait.

Tennis Court Reservations begin on Monday, April 2, 2012 - I.D. Card Required

TENNIS COURT RESERVATIONS: Between April and November, Township residents, 18 or older, can reserve a tennis court at Columbus Park for one hour per day – Monday-Friday – for play between 5:30 p.m. to 9:30 p.m. Court reservations are not required for weekends and all other weekday hours and operate on a first come, first served basis. The use of all other tennis courts are on a first come, first served basis. In order to make court reservations you must first register, in person, in the Recreation Department Office, to obtain a “tennis identification card”. Proof of Piscataway residency is required. There is no charge for the I.D. card, or to reserve a court. After obtaining an I.D. card, reservations can be made by calling the Recreation Office – 9 a.m. – 4 p.m. (only) – at 732-562-2382. Court reservations begin on Monday, April 2, 2012.

Note: Due to the extensive damage at Riverside Park caused by Hurricane Irene picnic permits will not be issued this year for Riverside Park. The park is under renovation. Picnic permits for Possumtown Park are available for Township residents and Piscataway based corporations or civic groups. Possumtown Park has two (2) groves and can hold 125 people/each.
