Recession pay an average of 23 percent less than the jobs lost during the recession. The report also shows that the gap between low-and higher-income households is growing and will continue into the foreseeable future.

Under the guidance of Mayor de Blasio, the task force was focused on three issues: reducing income inequality, promoting early childhood education, and expanding access to broadband. Mayor de Blasio said that our mayors are going to demand and create a political atmosphere to hold those in power to be accountable to the millions of people who live in our cities. Following discussions, the Task Force released a "Commitment to Action" that contains principles that will guide the work of the Task Force and includes recommendations for local actions in three beginning policy areas as well as federal policy changes needed to support local innovation.

As one of the mayors noted, the most important and apparent thing was that this commitment to action by this Task Force isn't a Democratic thing, this isn't a Republican thing, this is the right thing to do. This bipartisan effort will continue to move forward and

make sure that we find ways to close the income inequality and wage gaps between the haves and the have-nots. Several additional Task Force meetings are in the works.

## RENTAL OF HOUSING UNITS IN PISCATAWAY, NJ

Are YOU the landlord of a residential property in Piscataway Township? Have YOU registered your rental property? The Township Ordinance No. 08-18 – RENTAL OF HOUSING UNITS – requires landlord identity and must be filed annually in the Township Clerk's office by March 1st of each year. This includes ALL single unit dwellings and two unit dwellings that are not owner occupied. Neither the tenant nor the landlord shall permit more tenants to occupy the dwelling unit than the maximum number of tenants set forth in the approved Landlord Registration Statement (Ord. No. 08-18-22A-6). The maximum number of tenants inhabiting a building rented for residential purposes shall be stated in the approved Registration Statement. It shall be an unlawful violation for a tenant, landlord or owner of a dwelling unit to allow a greater number of people than the permitted maximum number of tenants, listed in the Landlord Registration Statement, to rent or occupy any dwelling unit. Ordinance No.08-18 – 16-11.12 covers Violation for False Information and 16-11.15 covers Violations and Penalties.

- Residents entering the Center must have their vehicle properly insured, inspected and registered. The largest vehicle allowed in the Center is a half-ton pickup. Pickup trucks must surrender two (2) Coupons. NO COMMERCIAL TRUCKS OR TRUCKS WITH SIDEBOARDS ARE PERMITTED.
- PLEASE NOTE: Residents must obtain Coupons in the Tax Office in the Municipal Building to obtain leaf bags. (Tax Office hours: Monday-Friday, 8:30 a.m. – 12:20 p.m. & 1:30 p.m. – 4:30 p.m.) Residents will be given two (2) free Coupons; each Coupon is for one (1) bundle of twenty (20) bags. Additional Coupons may be purchased for \$6.00 per bundle. LEAF BAGS WILL NOT BE ISSUED WITHOUT COUPONS.
- LEAF BAGS: Biodegradable leaf bags will be available on October 1, 2014 at the DPW garage – Monday-Friday – 7 a.m. – 6 p.m. PROOF OF RESIDENCY IS REQUIRED. These bags are to be used for LEAVES ONLY. Leaf pick up begins the week of October 15, 2014 and will continue until December 31, 2014.
- Christmas trees will not be picked up curbside. During the month of January only, you may bring them to your nearest firehouse anytime during the day. Trees, devoid of all decorations, may be brought to the Recycling Center during regular hours.

## PISCATAWAY RECEIVES LEADERSHIP AWARD

The 2014 Leadership Award was presented to Piscataway Mayor Brian C. Wahler and Township landscape architect, Henry Hinterstein, at the 6th Annual Sustainable Raritan River conference and Awards Ceremony held at Rutgers Cook Campus Center. The award was given for the installation of an ADA compatible launch dock for paddle craft at Piscataway’s Riverside Park. The dock was constructed to be able to access the Raritan River for fishing and launching kayaks or other small boats that can be carried down to the dock. The dock can be easily disconnected and secured to the shore line when flood waters are forecast.

The Sustainable Raritan River Collaborative is a network of organizations, governmental entities and businesses in the Raritan River region that work together to restore the Raritan River, its tributaries and its estuary for current and future generations.
