Is there *anyone* unhappy about the fact that spring has finally arrived? This winter has been particularly harsh. Piscataway has endured bitter cold temperatures and eight or nine major winter storms. Residents and others traveling in and out of the Township hardly need to be reminded of the road conditions that ensued due to the unrelenting snow storms, frigid temperatures and ice – often all three in combination. For the most part our long-suffering residents were patient and understanding and I am very appreciative of the many notes and calls my office received commending our Department of

Public Works Department. They worked tirelessly, under extremely difficult conditions, to keep our roads as safe as possible.

Speaking of safety, Piscataway has been named one of the 50 safest communities in New Jersey by SafeWise. The company paired data from the FBI's Crime in the U.S. Report with their own comprehensive investigation and created an all-inclusive list of the top New Jersey safest communities. Much of the credit goes to our law-abiding citizens and especially to our very active Community Policing Section. A Citizen Police Academy, D.A.R.E program, Youth Police Academy, National Night Out and Neighborhood Watch initiatives are just a few ways police have successfully united with citizens to stand strong against crime.

As you will note elsewhere in this newsletter the Township is gearing up for a wide variety of activities in the coming months. Piscataway's own museum, the *Metlar-Bodine Museum's Annual Dinner/Auction* will be held on April 5th. This is an



*Recycling/Trash Center Coupons and Recycling Center ID Passes have been mailed to all residential property owners. The Piscataway Township, 2014 Recycling ID Card MUST BE PRESENTED AT THE GATE, along with Drivers License as Proof of Residency. The Rules and Hours of the Center were enclosed in the mailing.

* Coupons are required for bagged brush, lumber, household debris, carpeting, furniture and all other acceptable non-recyclable materials.

* Coupons are required for grass disposal and may be purchased in the Tax Office starting March 31, 2014 – 8:30 a.m. – 12:20 p.m. and 1:30 p.m. – 4:30 p.m. Cost per Coupon is \$1.00, minimum purchase – two (2).

* Coupons are not required for disposal of recyclable materials. This includes all recyclables picked up curbside, in addition to batteries, (2) tires, motor oil, antifreeze and metal. Brush may be brought to the mini-dump but can not be longer than 5 foot lengths or greater than 4 inches in diameter.

* Residents are encouraged to recycle hazardous household material and paint at Middlesex County locations on the designated dates and times. REMINDER: WE DO NOT ACCEPT ANY HAZARDOUS WASTE OR TOXIC WASTE MATERIALS, CHEMICALS OR PAINTS AT THE DPW MINI DUMP.

*All residents entering the Mini Dump must have their vehicles properly insured, inspected and registered in Piscataway. NO TRUCKS LARGER THAN HALF TON PICKUPS ARE ALLOWED AND NO TRUCKS WITH SIDEBORDS WILL BE ALLOWED. Pickup trucks and full size vans are required to surrender two (2) passes per visit.

* ELECTRONIC WASTES are now accepted at the Recycling Center. Residents still have the option of bringing them to: SIMS – 401 MILL ROAD, EDISON, NJ on the 1st Saturday of each month – 9 a.m. – 1 p.m., and the 3rd Monday of each month – 12 p.m. – 4 p.m.

* Residents can schedule two (2) Bulk Trash pick ups and one (1) Brush pick up from January to mid-October. Branches must be bundled and tied –NO BAGGED BRUSH IS ALLOWED. During the summer months there may be a 6-8 week wait.
