The official grand reopening and ribbon cutting of the Piscataway Senior Citizen Center was held in May with over 400 residents and officials in attendance. It is truly a state-of-the-art facility! The 2010 Census showed a 19 percent increase in our senior population, up from the 2000 Census. As I wrote about in the 2013 spring Piscataway News it was clear that an overhaul of the cramped senior citizen building would be necessary. And now it is a fait accompli!

The additional 3500 square feet brings the building size up to 18,000 square feet. It includes a separate computer lab, classroom space, a

large multi-purpose room, two new bathrooms, a pavilion and courtyard, as well as an improved kitchen for the County Meals on Wheels program that is organized in our Township senior center. It also gives the Office of Emergency Management (OEM) a home for emergency equipment which until now was scattered and stored in several buildings in town. Although I've said it before, it bears repeating, our senior population is a significant and integral part of what makes Piscataway a great place to live.

For those of you who have not had an opportunity to visit the senior center, you are always welcome to drop by for a tour as well as to schedule a tour of Sterling Village, the Township's low and moderate income housing, which is within walking distance of the Senior Center and the J. F. Kennedy Library.

Once again the Cultural Arts Commission has arranged a wonderful summer concert series to be held on Thursdays beginning on July 3rd and ending on August 28th. The concerts are held in Columbus Park and begin at 7 p.m. Bring your lawn chair, relax and enjoy the melodious sounds of summer music.



Piscataway Happenings

The Health Advisory Commission reminds residents that to really enjoy summer vacations and recreational activities with their children be sure never to leave children alone near a pool; make sure adults watching young children in a pool know CPR and can rescue a child if necessary. If the pool depth is 24" or more, a 4' high fence is required either around the pool or property, unless it is an above ground pool at least 4' high – which case the pool acts as a fence. Most children are not developmentally ready for swim lessons until after their fourth birthday. To avoid bug bites don't use scented soaps or hair sprays on children as these products may attract stinging insects. To remove a visible insect stinger from skin, gently scrape it off horizontally with a credit card or your fingernail. You can also remove a stinger by pinching it out with a pair of tweezers or your fingers. Should your child receive an animal bite that breaks the skin, no matter how minor the injury appears, contact your pediatrician. The doctor will check to see if your child has been adequately immunized against tetanus.

***TENNIS COURT RESERVATION** – Between April and November, Township residents, 18 years of age or older, can reserve a tennis court at Columbus Park for one (1) hour – Monday – Friday, for play from 5:30 p.m. to 9:30 p.m. Court reservations are not required for weekends and all other weekday hours and operate on a first come, first serve basis. In order to reserve a court, you must register, in person, in the Recreation Office in order to obtain a "Tennis Identification Card". Piscataway residency is required at registration. There is no charge for the ID card or to reserve a court. After obtaining the ID card, reservations may be made by calling the Recreation Office between 9 a.m. and 4 p.m., **ONLY**.

PISCATAWAY ROAD IMPROVEMENTS

****TOWNSHIP RECEIVES \$300,000.00 FOR LAKEVIEW AVENUE ROAD IMPROVEMENTS...**

The section of Lakeview Avenue between Fairview Avenue and Washington Avenue will be reconstructed and resurfaced, including improvements to curbs, drainage, driveway aprons, sidewalks and handicap ramps. This project, funded by a \$300,000.00 grant from the New Jersey Department of Transportation, is scheduled to be completed by the early spring of 2015. The road will be closed to thru traffic until completion of the project. A detour will be in place to direct traffic around the project.

****BROOKSIDE ROAD...**

The improvement of Brookside Road will begin in late fall 2014 – early 2015, and will consist of full depth paving between Metlars Lane and Poplar Road. In anticipation of this roadway project, the Township worked with the utility companies to complete the relocation of utility poles and the upgrade of the existing 6-inch waterline to an 8-inch waterline. This will improve the water service flow to all the residents within the project limits. This section of the road will be closed to thru traffic, but will be open and accessible to residents living in the area of construction and for emergency vehicles. This project includes full depth pavement, curbs, drainage improvements and sidewalks. The construction plans are available for viewing in the Community Development Department-Engineering Division.

****WILLIAM STREET PHASE III IMPROVEMENTS COMPLETED...**

The work included removal of the existing roadway pavement and resurfacing, as well as installation of Belgium block curbs, sidewalks, landscape walls, drainage improvements, driveway aprons and handicap ramps.

NOTE: Department of Public Works WILL NOT pick up leaf bags until the fall. Residents may bring them to the Mini-Dump during regular noted hours (above).

Required: (1) Coupon per bag. GRASS DISPOSAL COUPONS: Each bag of grass, leaves, bagged brush, and vegetation being dropped off at the Mini-Dump is required to have a GRASS DISPOSAL COUPON. Coupons can be purchased for \$1.00 per coupon (minimum purchase two (2) coupons) and are available for purchase in the Tax Office – Monday – Friday, 8:30 a.m. – 12:20 p.m. and 1:30 p.m. – 4:30 p.m. or by mail. Send SASE and check made out to: Tax Office, 455 Hoes Lane, Piscataway, NJ 08854. COUPONS ARE ONLY VALID FOR THE YEAR IN WHICH THEY ARE ISSUED. *Please purchase only the coupons you think you will use. There are no refunds.*

- Recycling Trash Center Coupons and Recycling Center ID passes and rules and regulations have been mailed to all residential owners. The 2014 Coupon MUST BE PRESENTED AT THE GATE, along with Driver’s License as Proof of Residency.
- Coupons are required for lumber, household debris, carpeting, furniture and all other non-recyclable materials. Coupons are NOT required for disposal of recyclable material, including batteries, tires, motor oil, branches, metal (washers, dryers, dishwashers, hot water heaters, refrigerators, air conditioners) and all recyclables picked up curbside. NOT ACCEPTABLE: Paint, Hazardous Waste, Kitchen Garbage, Contractor Debris, Dirt/Rocks/Stones. Televisions, VCRs, Computers, Printers, Monitors may be brought to the Recycling Center.
- Residents entering the Center must have their vehicle properly insured, inspected and registered in Piscataway. The largest vehicle allowed is a half-ton pick up truck. NO COMMERCIAL VEHICLES OR TRUCKS WITH SIDE BOARDS ARE PERMITTED AND NO BOXED U-HAULS OR MOVING TRUCKS ARE PERMITTED. PICK UP TRUCKS REQUIRES TWO (2) COUPONS.
- Curbside Trash/Brush Pickup by Appointment: Homeowners may schedule two (2) trash pickups, and one (1) branch pickup from January to the middle of October. To schedule a curbside pickup, call DPW @ 732-562-2390.

RED...WHITE...& BOOM!

It's been documented. Not only did George Washington sleep in Piscataway, he also dined, entertained, and established – with a few stokes of a quill pen – a monumental American patriotic tradition that continues to this very day...

In July 1778, General George Washington's headquarters was at *Ross Hall* on River Road in Piscataway and 11,000 Patriots were camped on the banks of the Raritan River. It was in Piscataway, at *Ross Hall*, that Washington wrote *the first order for America's Army to celebrate the 4th of July*. The troops were ordered to put green boughs in their hats, march across the river on Landing Lane Bridge, line the banks of the Raritan in New Brunswick, and shoot their muskets down and up the line in *the first United States Armed Forces' salute to the nation's Independence!*

The Patriots were given an extra ration of rum and, that evening, the General hosted a party for officers, including the Marquis de Lafayette, Baron von Steuben, Alexander Hamilton, and their ladies at *Ross Hall*. *Ross Hall* was destroyed in the 1960s, but because of its significance, a parlor wall was saved and until 2000 was exhibited at the NJ Historical Society when it was given to Piscataway and the Metlar-Bodine House. The intention is to have *The Ross Hall Wall*, a significant artifact of America's past, recognized as an "American Treasure" and interpret it, and the incredible historical moment it represents, in a new wing of the museum.

JOIN US in celebrating this momentous historic event and support Piscataway's own museum – the Metlar Bodine House Museum – at a tasting of George Washington's favorite libation – Madeira wine – hosted by professional Sommelier Brian Maher, followed by hors d'oeuvres, dancing and music in the 18th century tradition.
