**T**ime for us to reshuffle the resolutions we meant to keep last year, mix them in with the resolutions we make this year and hope for the best as the year moves along. I wish all of our residents a happy, prosperous and healthy 2015 and remind you that if you have questions or need information, please do not hesitate to contact my office at 732-562-2301.

Well we did it again! Unsolicited, MONEY magazine again named Piscataway one of the 50 best places to live in the United States, ranking us number 27. Only two other towns in New Jersey made the list. The Township was also named one of the best places to live in 2008 and in 2010. Cited was the long and prestigious history of the community and the fact that among other

things, we are a culturally diverse community and home to Rutgers University, RWJ Medical School, and many national and international companies. It was also noted that the Township provides high paying stable jobs. MONEY ranks the best places to live, beginning with 781 cities, whittles it down to 537, then to 100 and eventually to the top 50. As part of their rating system MONEY looks for economic opportunity, housing affordability, education, health, crime and arts and leisure. Receiving this accolade only reinforces what we already know – that Piscataway is a wonderful livable, walkable community in which to live. I congratulate all our residents who make our Township exactly what it is – one of the very best places to live.

We bid a fond farewell to Ward 1 Councilman Mark Hardenburg as he retires after 35 years as a Township Councilman. Mark, a lifelong Piscataway resident, has always been an advocate, not only for his constituents in Ward 1, but for all the citizens of Piscataway. His political career began in June 1980 when he replaced a councilman who moved out of town. That November, he ran for the remaining two years of his predecessor's term, won, and

has won re-election every four years since. He has served four times as Council President. Mark has also been an active volunteer Arbor Hose fireman and a member of the Board of Fire Commissioners. Mark was once quoted as saying, "I enjoy politics, so that's what I do. I'm just doing what I enjoy." So at this juncture in Mark's life we thank him for his many, many years of community service and know that for him and his family, the best is yet to come.

Reminder: while many people are particularly generous at holiday time with food donations for those in need, hunger, unfortunately, knows no season. We know there is a desperate need for food around the world but you should not be surprised to know that there is a need right here in our own backyard. Both libraries, J. F. Kennedy and Westergard have food bins year round, and the local FISH organization, 456 New Market Road (732-968-7925) also collects food all year. In New Brunswick, Elijah's Promise, 18 Neilson Street (732-545-9002) feeds the hungry on a daily basis, an average of 300 meals each day. Perhaps assisting these organizations can be added to your New Year's resolutions.

## Michael E. Griffith, Piscataway Councilman At Large



Michael E. Griffith, a long time Piscataway resident and At Large Township Councilman died after a long illness in November 2014 at the age of 57. In 2007, Michael was appointed to fill the unexpired council term of a councilman who relocated to another state. In 2008, he was elected to a full council term and was re-elected in 2012. He served two terms as Council President. Mike both managed and coached Little League teams, and for 12 years was a head coach in the Piscataway Recreation Basketball Program.

Michael was a member of the North Stelton A.M.E. Church where he served as the vice chairman of the Steward Board. Mayor Brian Wahler expressed sentiments echoed by his council colleagues and others. "Mike Griffith was probably one of the smartest, kindest men you would ever meet. He cared deeply about our Piscataway community and his shoes will be exceedingly difficult to fill".

Michael leaves behind his wife, Margaret (Patsy), his daughter, Mindy, his son, Michael, his mother, brother and a host of in-laws, cousins, nieces and nephews.

- Residents will receive Recycling Center/Mini Dump 2015 Coupons & Recycling Center ID Pass Cards in the mail in the next few months. These coupons and pass cards **MUST** be presented at the gate along with Driver’s License as proof of residency. Coupons are required for bagged brush, lumber, household debris, carpeting, furniture and all other non-recyclable materials. In addition to batteries, tires, motor oil, branches, leaves and metal. Coupons are not required for disposal of recyclable materials, including recyclables picked up curbside. The largest vehicle allowed in the Recycling Center is a half-ton pickup truck. No trucks with built up sideboards are allowed. Pickup trucks must surrender two (2) coupons plus an additional coupon for a trailer no larger than 4x8 feet.
- **NOT PERMITTED, HAZARDOUS OR TOXIC WASTE, CHEMICALS OR PAINTS, CONTRACTOR DEBRIS, DIRT, CONCRETE OR OTHER ROCK TYPE DEBRIS.** NOTE: Electronics can be brought to the mini-dump during mini-dump hours. No electronics will be picked up curbside.
- Residents may schedule two (2) bulk trash curbside pickups and one (1) brush curbside pickup per household per calendar year. Call 732-562-2390 to schedule an appointment. The curbside/bulk pickup resumes on Tuesday, January 6, 2015.
- **REMINDER:** Christmas trees will not be picked up – residents may bring them to your local firehouse only during the month of January or they can be brought to the Recycling Center during winter hours. Trees must be devoid of all decorations – trees will be recycled.

Piscataway’s ANIMAL CONTROL services are handled by the Township of Edison through a shared services agreement. Services include:

- Animal nuisance complaint investigations and inquiries
- Investigation of animal bites
- Quarantining and releasing animals involved in bites
- Picking up injured/dead animals
- Picking up stray animals
- Transportation of injured animals to animal hospital
- Cruelty to animals complaint investigations
- Arrange for transportation of specimens to State Health Department Laboratory for rabies testing
- Enforcement of ordinances/laws relating to animal control
