Our Department of Public Works wants to remind residents about very important sanitary sewer issues. Products called “flushable wipes” tend not to disintegrate though they may be advertised as such. The Sewer Division urges residents to refrain from using these products as they tend to interfere with the mechanism in the pumping stations requiring costly maintenance and repairs. Be aware also that it is prohibited to connect sump pumps and roof leaders into the sanitary sewer system of your home or business. These flows must discharge into an approved storm water system.

I remind you to be alert when driving to the quick movements that children can so often make. Send SASE and check made out to: Tax Office, 455 Hoes Lane, Piscataway, NJ 08854. COUPONS ARE ONLY VALID FOR THE YEAR IN WHICH THEY ARE ISSUED. Please purchase only the coupons you think you will use. There are no refunds.

*Recycling Trash Center Coupons and Recycling Center ID passes and rules and regulations have been mailed to all residential owners. The 2016 Coupon MUST BE PRESENTED AT THE GATE, along with Driver's License as Proof of Residency.

*Coupons are required for lumber, household debris, carpeting, furniture and all other non-recyclable materials. Coupons are NOT required for disposal of recyclable material, including batteries, tires, motor oil, branches, metal (washers, dryers, dishwashers, hot water heaters, refrigerators, air conditioners) and all recyclables picked up curbside. NOT ACCEPTABLE: PAINT, Hazardous Waste, Kitchen Garbage, Contractor Debris, Dirt/Rocks/Stones. Televisions, VCRs, Computers, Printers, and Monitors may be brought to the Recycling Center.

*Residents entering the Center must have their vehicle properly insured, inspected and registered in Piscataway. The largest vehicle allowed is a half-ton pick up truck. NO COMMERCIAL VEHICLES OR TRUCKS WITH SIDE BOARDS ARE PERMITTED AND NO BOXED U-HAULS OR MOVING TRUCKS ARE PERMITTED. PICK UP TRUCKS REQUIRES TWO (2) COUPONS.

SETTING A SUSTAINABLE EXAMPLE: GREENING OUR STATEHOUSE

Leading by example was my intention when introducing legislation to encourage environmental sustainability in New Jersey's state house. The bill was inspired by a trip to Israel where I saw firsthand the country's efforts to "green" their Legislature which created significant savings. By increasing the level in which state buildings are investing in environmental sustainability measures, we can start to make a difference in reversing the negative impacts that our buildings can have on the environment and set an example for others throughout the state. I am certain that we all can agree that the added fiscal benefit to the taxpayers is a compelling factor.

From simple solutions such as switching to LED lights to larger investments like installing solar panels and electric vehicle charging stations in state-owned buildings, the State of New Jersey could be a leader in reducing our carbon footprint. Senate Bill Number 769 requires the State Capitol Joint Management

Commission to create an environmental sustainability plan specifically for the State House Complex, including energy efficiency, water conservation and emission reduction techniques. The bill would require the commission to consider sustainability initiatives and solutions with respect to contracting, management and operation of the Complex.

I am pleased to report that this measure was approved by the Senate Environment Committee and was referred to the Senate Budget and Appropriations Committee where it awaits consideration by the members.

FUN FACT: *Our New Jersey State Capital, pictured above, is the second oldest working statehouse in the Nation! Originally built in 1792, portions of the original structure, pictured to the right, were incorporated into the building. Less than an hour away, the State House is open for tours.
