MAYOR'S MESSAGE

"It only took a half a century"
 As reported in a recent article in the Courier News, the \$28 million project, the completion of the Route 18 extension through Piscataway, has only taken half a century to complete. This state project is finally coming to fruition. Over the decades the roadway, which stretches from Piscataway to Wall in Monmouth County, has been improved and in Piscataway the work stretches back over 20 years, beginning in 1994 when Hoes Lane was connected to Metlars Lane. The second phase went from the intersection of Metlars Lane and Hoes Lane to the John Lynch Bridge. The final phase, Section 3A began in 2012 and runs from Buckingham Drive on Hoes Lane to Route 287. It was derailed for a while by super storm Sandy and the need for utility companies to be redeployed to repair Sandy-related damage elsewhere in New Jersey. Those companies disappeared for about 16 months which further slowed the project. The project has also provided a multi-purpose pedestrian path, sidewalks and two overhead crosswalks making it

safe, in particular for students, to cross over the busy highway. Even bicyclists now have a safe route that never existed before. NJDOT added the construction of Stockton Street to the project which now connects Buena Vista Avenue to Hoes Lane allowing for access to the library and the senior center.

I understand how very frustrating this (and other) roadway construction has been for our Township residents and for the thousands of people who drive through our community every day. Please know that your patience has been much appreciated. The NJDOT projected final completion of Route 18 is summer 2016. While these improvements may not solve all of our traffic woes it should make it considerably safer for motorists, pedestrians and bicyclists.

*We had a wonderful well-received summer Concert in the Park Series in Columbus Park this year thanks to the Cultural Arts Commission, Kitty Juttner,

chair. We held an additional concert in Veterans'/Possumtown Park which ended the season on a high note. *As the fall approaches it gets darker earlier each day so please be mindful of the children walking to and from school and remind them to always cross at the crosswalks. We wish the students and teachers an exciting school year. *Fall also brings us football fever and we send our good wishes to Coach Danny Higgins and the Piscataway High School football team, and for Rutgers University football and Coach Kyle Flood, the same best wishes. *We are gearing up to celebrate Piscataway's 350th birthday in 2016. PLEASE DO NOT FEED THE WILDLIFE...

Experts tell us that feeding most wild animals just isn't a good idea and can do more harm than good. It makes wild animals lose their natural fear of people and wild animals and depending on people for food can cause injuries or spread disease, some of which can be transmitted to pets and humans. And what about the ubiquitous deer? The adage might be: "if you care, let them fend for themselves". Just because deer will eat a food provided by humans, particularly in winter, does not mean that it is good for them. Decades of research has clearly shown that supplemental feeding leads to increased disease risk, (many deer carry diseases such as Lyme disease), long-term habitat destruction, increased vehicle collisions, habituation to humans, and alteration of other deer behavior patterns and, ultimately, the demise of the value of deer and deer-related recreation. ****Recycling Center Coupons:** Coupons are mailed on a yearly basis to residents along with the required rules and regulations. Duplicate coupons may be obtained at the Public Works office. Coupons must be presented at the gate as well as a driver's license and proof of residency. Residents entering the Recycling Center must have their vehicle properly insured, inspected and registered. The largest vehicle allowed in the center is a half-ton pickup. Pickup trucks must surrender two (2) coupons. No commercial trucks or trucks with sideboards are permitted.

****Grass Coupons:** October 1, 2015 is the final day that residents will be required to present coupons at the Recycling Center.

****Curbside/Bulk Pick-Up:** October 9, 2015 is the final day for scheduled curbside/bulk pick ups. The program will resume on January 5, 2016.

***Leaf Bags:** Biodegradable leaf bags will be available October 1, 2015 through December 18, 2015 at the DPW yard, door #11 – Monday – Friday – 7 a.m. to 6 p.m.

****In addition, leaf bags will be made available on Saturday, November 7, 2015 from 8:30 a.m. – 4:15 p.m.**

Leaf bag pick-up will commence on October 19, 2015 and continues until December 31, 2015. **LEAF BAGS ARE TO BE USED FOR LEAVES ONLY.** To obtain leaf bags residents must obtain coupons at the Tax Office in the Municipal Building. (Tax Office hours: Monday-Friday – 8:30 a.m. – 12:20 p.m. & 1:30 p.m. – 4:30 p.m.)

Each coupon is for one (1) bundle of twenty (20) bags. Additional coupons may be purchased for \$6.00 per bundle. Leaf bags will not be issued without coupons and proof of residency. **Coupons are valid only for the year in which they are issued.**

****Christmas Trees:** Christmas trees will not be picked up curbside. You may bring Christmas trees (devoid of all decorations) to your nearest firehouse until January 31, 2016, or to the Recycling Center during regular hours.

Municipal Alliance Substance Abuse Task Force

Piscataway's Municipal Alliance, through collaborative community efforts, promotes awareness and knowledge of the nature and extent of substance use, abuse, and addiction and their effect on individuals, families, and communities.

The Alliance presents FREE family programming such as S.H.A.P.E. This program is a family skills training program designed to enhance the family standards of behavior, parental roles and adolescent identity incorporation into the family structure. Parents and children, separately and together, participate. The program presents four life-skills courses delivered in weekly three hour sessions with a private follow-up family coaching session. Another program, Training for Intervention Procedures (T.I.P.S.) is offered free to all of the alcohol serving establishments in the Township and surrounding areas and will help keep "under age alcohol abuse" to a minimum. Certification in this program lasts three years. FORSYTHE NATIONAL WILDLIFE REFUGE CLEANUP

The Forsythe National Wildlife Refuge, which protects 47,000 acres of New Jersey wetlands, marshes and coastal habitats, was the site of nearly 2,000 tons of debris deposited after Hurricane Sandy. Working under U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service (USFWS) supervision, cleanup crews finished removal of the wreckage last month and significant strides in cleanup have been made and we in the legislature are looking ahead to the completed restoration of this area marred by Sandy in 2012.

In addition to providing a home for migrating birds, this refuge is an ecotourism gem, so making progress here is a boon for both our environment and our economy in the Garden State. At the recent joint legislative committee meeting of the Senate Environment and Energy Committee and the Assembly Environment and Solid Waste Committee we highlighted the work of cleanup crews who removed massive amounts of debris from a coastal habitat in southern New Jersey.

We have made significant progress through the tireless cleanup and recovery efforts of the wildlife refuge since Hurricane Sandy wreaked havoc on this valuable coastal community, but the work here is not complete. We must continue to engage with officials at the federal level in order to continue making progress. We can now begin to restore and enhance the wildlife refuge, with its wetlands, salt marshes and coastal habitats along the Jersey Shore, and protect the area against any future storms.

New Jersey can now move toward the next phase of this process, which is restoring the habitat on behalf of local wildlife and planning ways to limit damage in the event of a future disaster. Due to its location in a highly active fight path for birds, the Forsythe National Wildlife Refuge plays a key role in seasonal bird migration, according to the USFWS. The refuge extends through parts of Ocean, Burlington and Atlantic counties.
