
network, members will also benefit from YMCA's nationwide membership which allows members to access all other participating YMCAs in the country.

Do you know where your local taxes go? Compared to 2017 and 2018, it's largely unchanged.

As shown in this pie chart, you can see how in 2019 after being collected by the Township, nearly three-quarters of the funds are then sent to the county, four fire districts (each with their own tax rate), library system and school board.

It's important to know that the Township Council takes some of its revenue and provides additional funding to the library system for its programming and personnel on top of what is automatically dedicated to its needs.



Driving Electric in the Garden State by Senator Bob Smith



Given the speed at which the planet is warming, it is imperative that we do all that we can to protect the environment.

This winter, New Jersey became a national leader in electric vehicles when Governor Murphy signed Senate Bill 2252. This legislation, which I sponsored, had strong bipartisan support and took years of dedicated teamwork among legislators, staff and stakeholders to ensure passage in

both houses. It was an honor to speak at the bill signing which took place in the Governor's Office. That day, Friday, January 17, 2020, our Garden State began the necessary transformation into a whole new world and put us on a path to 100 percent clean energy by 2050.

The law establishes goals for 330,000 electric vehicles by 2025 and to electrify NJ Transit buses. At the event, ChargeEVC CEO Pam Frank explained that in 2016, New Jersey had a blank slate with respect to electric vehicle market development, but with this law, many of the initiatives started under the Administration are now bolstered with a strong and stable statutory framework.

This law goes a long way to make the Garden State cleaner and greener by incentivizing consumers to purchase electric vehicles. The "Light Duty Plug-in Electric Vehicle Rebate Program" encourages the purchase of new electric vehicles with an MSRP below \$55,000 with a rebate up to \$5,000 over the next ten years. For example, a fully electric vehicle with a range of 200 miles qualifies for the full \$5,000 rebate and a hybrid electric car would qualify for a \$500 rebate. The New Jersey Board of Public Utilities administers the program and will work with the Center for Sustainable Energy in its development.

Increased usage of electric cars will greatly reduce the state's greenhouse gas emissions and improve air quality. This will have a major positive impact in our urban communities and along high traffic corridors, improving the quality of life for us all.

Beginning January 1, 2020, instead of paper coupons, etc., residents will use the new Piscataway Service Card featuring a unique UPC code for DPW services. Cards can be picked up at the DPW office located at 505 Sidney Road, Piscataway during business hours of Mondays-Fridays from 8:30 a.m.-12:20 p.m. and 1:30-4:30 p.m. Only checks and credit/debit cards may be used to add funds for grass credits or additional leaf bags to your Service Card. No cash is accepted.

Credits are required for grass disposal and may be purchased in the Public Works Office starting Monday, March 2nd, 8:30 a.m.-12:20 p.m. & 1:30-4:30 p.m., and are good for the current year only. Cost: \$1 per credit (minimum purchase) for two credits. The Recycling Center will accept bagged grass with credits starting Tuesday, April 7th. Credits will be placed on the service card account when purchased.

Credits are also required for lumber, household debris, carpeting, furniture and all other non-recyclable materials. Every year credits will be placed into the account for four trash visits and two curbside pickups. A passenger vehicle requires one credit and a pickup truck requires two credits. Residents must provide a service card for recyclable materials such as batteries, tires (maximum two per trip), motor oil, branches, leaves, metal, various plastics and glass, cardboard and paper. Brush may be brought to the Mini Dump but may not be longer than five (5) feet in length or greater than four (4) inches in diameter. Recycling and brush trips are unlimited but residents must have their service card for each visit.

Not permitted are kitchen garbage, hazardous or toxic waste, chemicals, paints, contractor debris, dirt, concrete or any other type of rock debris.

Electronic devices covered by the NJ Electronic Waste Management Act includes televisions, desktop & personal computers, monitors, printers and fax machines. They may be brought to the Recycling Center during hours of operation. Electronics will not be picked up curbside.

Hazardous materials

Residents are encouraged to recycle hazardous household materials and paint at Middlesex County's designated locations at announced dates & times. Piscataway Township does not accept any hazardous waste, toxic waste materials, chemicals or paints at its Recycling Center & Mini Dump.

Bulk pick-ups

Residents may schedule two (2) bulk trash curbside pickups and one (1) brush curbside pickup per calendar year by calling (732) 562-2390 for an appointment. Residents must have their service card before calling. The last appointments can be made in mid-September and the program ends in the second week of October. During the summer months there may be a six to eight week wait. Branches must be bundled and tied. No bagged brush is allowed.

Arriving

All residents entering the Mini Dump must have their vehicles properly insured, inspected and registered. Open toed and flip flops are not allowed to be worn in the center. No trucks larger than half-ton pickups and no trucks with sideboards are allowed. Pickup trucks and full size vans are required to provide two (2) credits per visit.

Parking is available in the visitor lot facing Sidney Road. Please enter through the building's main entrance.

Be mindful of what you flush

The Piscataway sewer system is designed to flow from your home through the Township owned sewer lines to the treatment plant in Sayreville. In some areas, due to the topography, flow has to go uphill and must be assisted by lift stations known as pump stations. At this point, certain elements have to be excluded as the pumps can get jammed by materials such as fabrics, both woven and non-woven. Other types of products include baby wipes, chemically treated wipes, sanitary napkins and most paper towels. Although many manufacturers of these products list them as flushable, in reality, they are not. We ask that you dispose of these non-flushable materials via your regular garbage collection for deposit at a landfill. By complying, you will reduce the possibility of you having a plumbing company rectify a sewer blockage at an estimated cost of \$125 per hour.

2020 Census FAQ

What is the census?

The census is a count of every person who lives in the United States and its territories. It happens every 10 years. In early 2020, you will be asked to count everyone who lives in your home as of April 1. Responding to the 2020 Census is a chance to shape your future.

Is my information safe?

Your responses to the 2020 Census are safe, secure, and protected by federal law. Your answers can only be used to produce statistics. They cannot be used against you by any government agency or court in any way—not by the FBI, not by the CIA, not by the DHS, and not by ICE.

What will I be asked?

You will be asked a few simple questions, like age, sex, and the number of people who live in your home, including children.

What won't be asked?

The census will never ask for Social Security numbers, bank or credit card numbers, money or donations, or anything related to political parties.

When can I respond to the census?

In early 2020, every household in America will receive a notice to complete the census online, by phone, or by mail. In May, the U.S. Census Bureau will begin following up in person with households that have yet to respond.

What's in it for me?



Your responses inform where over \$675 billion is distributed each year to communities nationwide for clinics, schools, roads, and more.



Census data gives community leaders vital information to make decisions about building community centers, opening businesses, and planning for the future.



Responding also fulfills your civic duty because it's mandated by the U.S. Constitution. The United States has counted its population every 10 years since 1790.



Your responses are used to redraw legislative districts and determine the number of seats your state has in the U.S. House of Representatives.
